Notes from the Spring General Membership Meeting

Neighbors gathered at Times Ten Cellars on Wednesday June 5th for the Spring General Membership meeting. We started the evening out with pizza and wine before getting down to business. The meeting started with an update



from our neighborhood police officer Sr. Corporal Dung Pham. He opened by telling us we had an "amazing neighborhood!" Crime is low and most of it occurs at the businesses along Mockingbird. He also commended our Volunteers in Patrol program and noted that a well organized neighborhood association is one of the best crime fighting tools out there. Our biggest issues are with BMV or burglary of a motor vehicle, He recommended that we remove all valuables from our cars, keep them locked, and park in the driveway or garage whenever possible. The best way to report a minor crime is online - go to dallaspolice.net and click on "File a Police Report Online. Finally Officer Pham reminded us to let our first responders know that we

support them. The Dallas Police Department is currently severely understaffed, and he suggested we contact our city council to ask that they increase funding.

Our next speaker was Dallas County Judge Clay Lewis Jenkins. He explained the role of the county government in Texas. The County Commissioners Court is similar to a city council but they oversee the entire county. Counties take care of issues such as health emergencies (pandemics, they run Parkland County Hospital); the county also works on issues such as floods, tornadoes, and homeland security emergency management. The County runs the county courts which serve as the main trial courts, runs the prison for those convicted of minor offenses, and oversees the public defenders office. The chief law enforcement officer for Dallas County is Sheriff Marian Brown. Finally the county also helps in area of workforce development as well as issues surrounding mental health and homelessness. The county has committed to building 3,000 affordable homes (not Section 8 homes) and often partners with private charities such as the Catholic Housing Initiative to achieve these goals.



Neighbors celebrated and closed out the 2024 pool season at Tietze Splash. This annual event is sponsored by Friends of Tietze Park, WHNA, Lakewood Heights NA and Lower Greenville NA.


