Legislature Land Use Bill

The Dallas City Plan Commission via Forward Dallas proposed major changes to land use in single family neighborhoods. There was plenty of feedback to the Dallas City Council and several of the objectionable parts were removed or revised. Thank you Councilman Ridley, for leading the effort for changes.

Now the Texas Legislature has a proposal in House Bill 878 to drastically restrict certain cities' ability to zone land for different uses. The 1st section of the bill would only apply to cities with populations of 85,000 or more that are wholly or partially in counties with populations of one million or more.

Cities that meet these guidelines would be forced to allow dwellings to be built on any lot with a square footage of 2,500 or more. The current typical lot size in Dallas for a single family home is 5,000 - 7,500 sq. ft. Also, the city could not require lots to be wider than 16 feet or deeper than 30 feet.

A second section of the bill would compel all cities and towns (large or small) to accept a second dwelling (an accessory dwelling unit or ADU) on every lot in established single-family zoned areas. The ADU can be up to 50% of the square footage of the primary dwelling. Additionally, the lot owner would not be required to live there, and the owner has the right to lease both dwellings.

This bill is discriminatory in that it applies to cities of 85,000 people or more and leaves smaller cities free to determine land use locally. 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
